While Peter was still speaking, the Holy Spirit fell upon all who heard the word. THE SERMON The Very Rev. Dr. Warren Leibovitch

THE NICENE CREED

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen. Hearts & Hands Ministries

FOOD BANKS We continue to collect nonperishable items for our local Food Banks. You can deposit your nonperishable food donations in the boxes outside the Parish Hall, one at the front door and another at the south door near the Chapel. Your offerings will be blessed on the first Sunday of each month.

The Sahuarita Food Bank collects cardboard—that includes cereal box styles as well as clean milk cartons. The receptacle is located on the south side of the Food Bank, beside the Good Shepherd Church on La Cañada.

Thank you to our parishioners who donated 142 pounds of food for the food bank in the first quarter of the year. And to Jan Hall, Heart & Hands volunteers, the DOK and the many parishioners who prepared and donated 120 Easter Baskets with donated toys and candy.

Remember, money is always welcome for any of our ministries—simply write your check payable to St. Francis with the ministry name in the memo line and we'll take care of the rest. Drop your check in the Offering Basket on Sunday morning or drop it off at the Parish Office during the week.

Please drop clean, reusable grocery bags and Dollar store bags into the KINO box in Donations room. These bags will be put to good use by people heading home to Mexico from Nogales and for those who have been granted asylum who have no suitcase or backpack.

PRISON MINISTRY We had 31 participants at the Reentry Simulation, 6 were members of the community and Episcopal churches in Tucson and Benson, along with 15 presenters who came from Arouet in Phoenix. Thank you to all who participated and helped with set up and clean up. Update. Camp Genesis camper Adrian has now been sentenced. If you would like to send him mail, stop by the Prison Ministry table for further information. We know how important it is to receive mail from our experiences with the women at Perryville women's prison.

A special Thank you to Joyce Davison who has volunteered to be the meeting coordinator during the summer.
